SENATOR VICKERS: After the enactment date of this particular piece of legislation.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Exactly.

SENATOR VICKERS: Obviously, we can't do anything before that enactment date.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay, with that understanding and that is precisely what I thought we agreed to, I think to accomplish that you absolutely have to have the amendment I am offering here and the amendment, if you will read it, simply says, "notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section or section 79-801.02, no annexation by a city or village encompassed within any school district, which annexation occurs after the effective date of this act, but before September 1, 1984, shall operate to change any school district boundaries in the area annexed." That would seem to be absolutely necessary if you are going to live with our moratorium agreement. Would you accept that amendment?

SENATOR VICKERS: Is that a question to me?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, sir.

SENATOR VICKERS: I need to ask you a question first.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay.

SENATOR VICKERS: Is that agreeable, Mr. President? May I ask Senator DeCamp a question?

PRESIDENT: Yes, please.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, Senator DeCamp, is it your intention with your amendment that the boundaries of the school districts could change in the annexed area if there was an annexation that took place following the enactment date of 465 until September 1st, 1984, is it your intention that the boundaries still could change following the September 1st, 1984 date based on whatever we come up with next year to allow those boundaries to change? In other words, are you freezing the boundary lines forever in this annexation?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Absolutely not. I want to do precisely what we agreed until September 1, 1984. I am gambling,
