SENATOR DeCAMP: I understand. Okay, then I would suggest that we adopt this amendment to the committee amendments, we then adopt the committee amendments and we get together between now and Select File and find out if that isn't acceptable to everybody and I am sure it will be, I think. I mean the other part you are talking about.

SENATOR VICKERS: Are you saying you are going to withdraw your amendment and adopt the committee amendments and then discuss it on Select? Is that what I heard you say?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, I want to make sure, to be very honest with you I don't personally want to support advancing the bill at this point until we have this language in there, or some equivalent thereof. Is that a problem?

SENATOR VICKERS: Because I don't want to...yes, I think so because I don't want to advance the bill until we make sure that we allow those local boards to continue negotiations either. I guess I....

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, since I am the easiest guy in the world to get along with, I will go along with this, one, adopting the committee amendments. Two, advancing the bill, and here in front of God, man and 48 other Senators, understanding that we don't, that there would be a battle royal on Select File unless we get this clarified that the lines can't be changed, that we are going to have a true moratorium.

SENATOR VICKERS: I have no problem with that because that is the intent. The intent is there....

SENATOR DeCAMP: You have got a deal.

SENATOR VICKERS: ...and the intent is also to allow the local people to make the decision. So that is fine with me.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay.

PRESIDENT: Do you withdraw your amendment, Senator?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Without objection, Senator DeCamp withdraws his amendment to the committee amendments and now we are back on the committee amendments, and we did have Senator Howard Peterson that wanted to be recognized on the committee amendments.
