The utility companies are raiding the treasury for \$5 million and it doesn't cause a ripple on the legislative strain. But I have the unpleasant task, the draining duty of dealing with if this issue today and in days to come because as long as this bill has life in it and I have life in me we are going to bump heads and sometimes a pedagogical tactic designed to bring about understanding is repetition, endless repetition. When a garment is dirty you wash it, you agitate it in a washing machine or you rub it on a corrugated washboard until the action of the water and the detergent loosen the soil and remove it and that which was dirty comes forth clean. My job is to take brains and rub them on the corrugated board of truth and information with such vigor and with such repetition that they become washed and come forth clean, that they depart from **the error of** their ways, that they remember that a day is going to come in the future when they will be addressing some group of high school students down here and telling them about obeying the law, the majesty of the Legislature, the appropriateness of the legislative principle and I heard Senator Vard Johnson on Capitol Review the other night say, "Rules, we live by rules. Rules enable this society to function. The rules must be obeyed," unless it is a utility company which has entered an illegal agreement. Then Senator Johnson must agree that we change the rules and when the one who writes the rules....

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...has a pencil with an eraser, you can do as you please and the rules become what you want them to be. For some reason I feel like I am in a losing battle but some of us who feel that the greater the odds, the harder we must fight, are what I think give inspiration to all of those who are outnumbered and face overwhelming odds but nevertheless, will not lose heart, will not give quarter, will not ask quarter. I am going to show what a representative is supposed to do in this legislative body when the interests of people are at stake. My amendment I hope you will adopt.
