But I do know one thing about the whole vet school issue, watching it carefully over the years, that it is one of the half a dozen issues that seems to be a decision made by the entire body ultimately each time, and when you try to stop that from happening, all it does is generate attempts on appropriations bills to deal with it, amendments on other bills, so on and so forth. At least if you have that physical bill out here, the vet school bill, isolating that subject, you are dealing with it in and of its own right and on its own merits and you are able to isolate and home in on what you want to do rather than going in a half a dozen directions and having flukish things happen. Now there are about ten excused, as you know, and some of those are people who would support this proposal or at least bringing it to the floor. So I think, to use that old phrase "out of the spirit of fairness", if there were two or three or four that would want to kind of assist at least getting the issue out here, whether you are going to ultimately oppose it, that might in the long run be the most efficient way of addressing the issue and saving time in the long run because at least you have got one fixed point to deal with it. I see my news friends all laughing. They think I am trying to con you into votes. Not true. I am trying to save time for the Legislature in the future and that is true. Senator Pappas mentioned the Animal Science building. I have never seen a proposal on the Animal Science building brought to the Legislature. Now that is true. I have never seen a bill. I think we had one a few years ago, and we did that. But they always talk about the Animal Science building but nobody brings a proposal. Bring it to us. Shoot, that may work. But you know you have got nothing to talk about until you at least honestly present a proposal in a bill, and that may be a substitute for this. I don't know. But at least present the bill before you say we never did anything on it. I would urge you to put the bill to the floor. Let it be discussed in its own right. I fear if it isn't, it will get too involved in too many other issues and, yes indeed, issues are related in here. Agriculture likes to look and say, we are entitled to something here and there. The cities like to look and say, we are entitled to this, and, yes, indeed, we do talk and say, well, we will recognize your needs but you have got to understand ours a little too. It is difficult to do that if you don't even have something here to talk about, and the bill out here at least makes a discussion piece so that we can all look
