Senator DeCamp would like to add his name to LB 183 as cointroducer.

PRESIDENT: If there is no objection, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, new resolution, LR 53 by Senator Morehead. (Read by title for the first time as found on pages 1156-1157 of the Legislative Journal.) That resolution will be laid over, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Very well. The Chair has just received a request from Sheldon Gallery to preserve the Pappas chair for the shrine. The Chair recognizes the Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, were we ready to start? Okay, I wanted to. . . ladies and gentlemen, if I might have your attention for a moment.

PRESIDENT: (Gavel.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: For those of you who missed, we will be going through the noon hour and winding up about two-thirty today. But if you will take your yellow sheet I will tell you which bills I have been requested to pass over. So looking at your yellow sheet and on the side at the top says "Consent Calendar", starting with #1, LB 171 cross it off. Down about 6, LB 318. Down further about halfway, 461. Then down at the bottom the first one under the second classification, LB 583. Turn over the page, down about two-thirds, LB 526. Those are the numbers that you should cross off. I will run through them one more time for you. Okay, 171, 318, 461, 583, 526, also another one I just...506 I understand has been handled already and then cross off 283, excuse me, 273. Sorry. 273 is the last one. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: The Chair would like to announce, obviously you are already, must be aware of the loaf of bread given to you this morning. It comes from the Nebraska Wheat Growers Association and seated under the South balcony as guests of Senators Clark, Cullan and Nichol are the 1993 Wheat Queen Karen Kresl of Hemingford. She is accompanied by the President of the Nebraska Wheat Hearts, Dorothy Davis of Potter and the Chairman of the Nebraska Wheat Board, Mr. Ray Davis of Potter and we would like to welcome you to the Legislative Chamber on this very special day and thank you for the loaf of bread.
