LB 326, 350

SPEAKER NICHOL: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Schmit, on the bill.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 326 requires persons who are requesting information on driver record information to provide the name and birthdate of the driver and it also, as I said earlier, had originally increased the fee. We struck that information, that portion of the bill, and we are now back down to another seventy-five cents fee which is adequate. It will decrease I believe some of the workload upon the Department of Roads or Motor Vehicles I mean, and I think that there may be an amendment which we will have to add on Select File to satisfy the press but at the present time I know of no objection to the bill. Move for its advancement.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any other discussion on the bill? If not, the question is, shall LB 326 advance. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. Move on to LB 350.

CLERK: 350 offered by senators Vickers and Lowell Johnson. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 17, referred to the Public Works Committee, advanced to General File. There are Public Works Committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Schmit, are you taking the amendments? While you are finding that, Senator Schmit, may I please introduce guests of Senator Pirsch this morning. In the North balcony we have 90 students from, fourth grade students, from Laura Dodge School and the teacher is Donna Howells, Betty Duryea and Ruth McVey and the principal is Katherine Fletcher. Would you please welcome them to the Legislature. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: The committee amendments increase the penalty for tampering with a device from \$500 as proposed by Senator Vickers to \$750. I believe it was Senator Hoagland's idea and the committee approved of it. I move the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion on the committee amendments? If not, the question is, shall the committee amendments be adopted. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
