been very unhappy about the present procedure under which the hunting is taking place. They feel very strongly that the bona fide farmer or rancher should have the right to hunt on his own land, and as a result of some disagreements with the Game Commission there has been a huge acreage up there which has been closed to hunting. And I submit that this is not good, this is not good from the standpoint of the person that wants to hunt. It is really not good from the standpoint of the farmer either because the relationship should be a good one. This is one small step to sort of erase some of the misunderstandings that there are. It would let some people hunt on land that they farm and it is not contiguous to the piece of land they happen to live on. It is a very minor increase in the privilege of the people that are out there feeding the game and the people that are letting other people come out and walk around on their farms and they feel very strongly they should have the same privilege on their own place without paying the fee. I ask that the amendment be adopted.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Lamb amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the Lamb amendment. Have you all voted that care to on the Lamb amendment? Senator Lamb, what do you think?

SENATOR LAMB: How many people are excused in case there is somebody sticking...there he is.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 7 nays on the adoption of Senator Lamb's amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Lamb amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Labeledz, do you wish to speak to the bill?

SENATOR LABEDZ: No, sir, just move for the advancement.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Newell, did you wish to speak to the bill? The question is, shall LB 170 advance? All those in favor say aye...we need a machine vote, excuse me, on this. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.
