LB 194, 230, 374

PRESIDENT: Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President. . .

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Carsten's amendment is found on page 757 of the Journal.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, we had these amendments printed in the Journal and I guess we had assumed we had adopted them and evidentially did not because they are not in the bill. I would ask unanimous consent to pass over 194 this morning until we get our problem on this bill, if it is a problem, and I don't think it is, it is just a matter of procedure, till we get it ironed out, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Very well, without objection the bill will be passed over, temporarily. LB 230.

CLERK: Read LB 230 on Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 230 pass. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 40 ayes, 1 nay, 2 present and not voting, 6 excused and not voting. Vote appears on pages 1215-16 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: A majority having voted in the affirmative, LB 230 is declared passed on Final Reading. The Chair would like to take the opportunity on behalf of Senator Labeledz to introduce her guests under the south balcony this morning, they are her daughter, Jan McReynolds, her granddaughter, Amy Jo McReynolds and her friend, Sheila Connolly. Welcome to the Legislature. We are now ready for LB 374.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Chambers would move to return LB 374 to Select File for a specific amendment. The amendment is found on page 1043 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Page 1043 of the Journal. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I'm going to be very brief with this amendment and I'll tell you everything involved in it. There are eight sections to it but really it doesn't do that much. What it does is
