debate has finished on motion to raise LB 588 and we are ready for a vote. We are under Call and all those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is to raise LB 588 notwithstanding the action of the committee. 30 votes are required and six members are excused at the present time which leaves us with 42 working members. A record vote has been requested. I believe all members present have voted. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 1255, Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to raise the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman. The Call is raised. The vote has resulted in a tie. It fails, not only because it is a tie but we didn't get enough votes either so the motion has failed. Very well, do you have anything on your desk, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Now we will move into reports. Senator Beutler and his Judiciary Committee have a confirmation report. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first report is from the Judiciary Committee. It is found on page 1092 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, your Judiciary Committee gave the first degree to Colonel Kohmetscher and Marj Marlette and Charles Benson and we are unanimously recommending their appointments. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the confirmation report? If not, all those in favor of the Judiciary Committee confirmation report vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the confirmation report.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The confirmation is complete. Senator Vickers confirmation report on the Education Committee, Mr. Clerk.
