PRESIDENT: Without objection, so ordered. Very well, we are ready for item number 5 on the agenda, motions. Senators DeCamp and Pappas. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp would move to suspend Rule 5, Section 4(c) to permit the introduction of a new bill, request 991.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President....

PRESIDENT: If you want to, eventually you will need 30 votes.

SENATOR DeCAMP: You know, it occurred to me, that is what I was going to mention. I just checked, there are 23 gone, not in yet. Now 49 minus 23 is 26 and this requires 30. Even with a lot of skill that is difficult.

PRESIDENT: Your arithmetic is good though.

SENATOR DeCAMP: But I am....however, I am going to move ahead. Mr. President....

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. Chairman...Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would suggest we work some of the other items there on the agenda and take this up a little bit later because when it is impossible, it is impossible even if it is Senator DeCamp. So with his permission I would ask that we do this.

PRESIDENT: Without objection, we will pass over the matter regarding the rule suspension. The next one is LB 194 on... is Senator Carsten here? Is Senator Goodrich here? Without objection, we will pass over LB 194 and proceed to LB 209.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Goodrich would move to return LB 209 to Select File for a specific amendment. The amendment is found on page 1213 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President and members of the body, LB 209 is a bill we have been processing through and it is over on Final Reading right now. You will all recall having seen in the paper about two weeks ago that there was
