for further action on other pieces of legislation, I would have no objection to that even though the Speaker is not in favor of that kind of procedure. Under these circumstances, and I suggest to you that this session and these times under which we are operating are not normal times that we deal with and that we may be needing to do some things that we are not all that enthusiastic about doing. So I would give to you the opportunity to advance this bill with the option of holding it at some further point for consideration of other bills that may be coming before us. If I have a little time left, I would ask by request to surrender or yield to Senator Lamb, Mr. Speaker.

PRESIDENT: Three minutes is left, Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, I merely rise to support Senator Carsten's position. We have probably a financial problem in this state. The Governor is supporting this bill. I think we should advance the bill and at some later time if it seems prudent not to pass it in its final form, we can make that decision, but we will be in a position to make that decision and at this point we don't know what is going to happen to these other forms of possible revenue that we are talking about, that it is prudent at this time to advance the bill and if necessary hold it at a later stage of debate.

PRESIDENT: Very well, the debate is closed on LB 396 and the motion is to advance it. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is to advance LB 396. 25 votes required to advance the bill. We are still anxious to have you record your vote if you care to vote on the bill. The motion is to advance LB 396. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and the bill is advanced. LB...we have had a request to pass over LB 371 and 371A. No, we haven't either. No, I have it marked because Schmit, I can never find Senator Schmit when I need him. The Clerk has matters on his desk to read into the record.
