PRESIDENT: Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: If it is agreeable with Senator Beutler, since there is so much confusion on these amendments to the committee amendments, would it be agreeable for Senator Beutler to lay over this bill until we correct the amendments and divide them out? It would be much easier that way.

PRESIDENT: Just at first glance the Chair is having difficulty reconciling the Journal page with the four-page printed copy. Senator Beutler, can you answer Senator Labeledz's point?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President, I feel like I would be remiss in agreeing to lay it over because I think what we are doing is clear and can be clarified, and if I lay it over, then the amendments will be filed as amendments to the committee amendments which will disadvantage the committee from the point of view of the discussion of this issue. So I do not wish to do that, Senator Labeledz.

PRESIDENT: Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Is it possible to take the standing committee report or the standing committee amendment and just discuss lines 1 through 12 if that will be agreeable with Senator Beutler? Or I move so.

PRESIDENT: That is the one I think we have just talked about.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes.

PRESIDENT: And the amendment to that standing committee amendment is that on page...just to strike lines 1 through 19 of the standing committee amendment. And I think that the Clerk suggested....

SENATOR LABEDZ: Are you looking at the Journal?

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Okay.

PRESIDENT: And the Clerk suggests that what we think really is intended to strike lines 1 through 12 because there is allimony. Senator Marsh, can you help us?

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you, Mr. President, I would try. I
