

budget at all I still think you're going to have a problem raising all the revenues required even for the proposed budget but I'm sure willing later on to look at where the cuts need to be made and sure willing to make them, maybe even more substantial. I guess you have to make a priority judgment here as to whether this money in industrial development which was originally there until they decided to keep the four offices open whether this money is going to do some good and I think one of the things we all ought to be considering pretty heavy is making sure we have some taxpayers out there to provide some revenue in the first place and the taxpayers are the companies and businesses that have factories that build buildings that put people to work and this is maybe the one most direct thing you can pick that attempts to do precisely that, build buildings, bring in companies, put employers here who ultimately are the taxpayers. Most of the other items in the budget are the types of things that at least don't directly generate income in the sales and income tax coffers. They are expenditures, whether they be the university or the other things, whereas this piddling little \$125,000 might result in ten, twenty, fifty, a hundred million in tax revenue so just use your own judgment and I'd sure be willing to work on cutting later on.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.
