SPEAKER NICHOL PRESIDING

SPEAKER NICHOL: Let's check in as soon as possible please so we can get started. Thank you. Senator Carsten, Senator Schmit, would you all check in please. Thank you. Senator Hannibal. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We will go back up to LB 142. Mr. Clerk, do you have something on LB 142?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 142 (read title). The bill was read on January 11th, referred to the Health Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. It was last considered on March 23. Mr. President, I do have amendments to the bill. Senator DeCamp had an amendment, Mr. President, on page 1105. Mr. President, I understand that he wishes to substitute an amendment for the one that he wishes to withdraw.

SPEAKER NICHOL: No objection, so ordered. Senator DeCamp, were you going to take the amendment first or what?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, I guess.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Do you think anybody in the whole place seems slightly interested from the appearance.

SPEAKER NICHOL: (Gavel) We must have it a little quieter in here so we can hear the speaker. We are taking off on an amendment here and you might be interested in it. So Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: If nothing else, I have noted that Senator Withem is paying close attention. Mr. President and members, I handed out the amendment this morning when I thought the bill was coming up. Let me hold it up. This is how it would read in your white copy and you have that physically on your desk. On the other side of it is really a very simple explanation and the essence of the amendment is that you take the original chiropractor's bill and in one point after another you quite frankly limit or take away from chiropractors things that they either are already doing or that they sought to do.
