

and as you and I well know, the Palmer method that was developed at the beginning of this century dealt simply with the articulation of the spine. The basic healing theory used by Palmer and his disciples dealt with the articulation and the manipulation of the spine. The chiropractors that I have known, the chiropractors that I have worked with, the chiropractors that I have talked to all acknowledge that that is the fountainhead of their art.

SPEAKER NICHOL: (Gavel) We must have it a little more quiet.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I say simply as we go about the business of providing chiropractors a reasonable licensing statute that I think simply speaking we should keep chiropractors along the same line of business, the same line of art that they have traditionally been engaged in, which simply is working with the spine. Lots of people rely upon that type of healing. Lots of people believe in that kind of healing. Lots of people find good results. However, the DeCamp amendments...the DeCamp amendments expand that area quite significantly. It is for that reason that I oppose those amendments, and this is not a humorous situation.
