SENATOR WAGNER: Yes, if we can get any call in votes I would certainly appreciate it. How many are excused, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Five excused.

SENATOR WAGNER: Five excused and we're one short then. Who would be the one that...there we go. All right.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp has asked for a roll call so we will have a roll call. Is there anyone else missing, Mr. Clerk, that we're....

CLERK: Everyone is here, Senator.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, proceed.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on pages 1351-1352 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill advances. We will move on to LB 432.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 432 was last considered on March 30. The E & R amendments were adopted. The bill failed to advance, Mr. President. I have nothing on the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Newell, on the bill.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, I move we advance the bill. This bill is a bill that tries to encourage some people who try to find work, who honestly try to better themselves to not be penalized if they are laid off the second time. That is the advancement.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye...a machine vote has been asked for. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the advancement of LB 432. Five are excused, Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, I didn't think it was all that controversial a bill but we probably ought to have a Call of the House.
