LB 269A, 476A

PRESIDENT: The motion is carried in the affirmative and the House is under Call. All members throughout the building and in your offices please report to the legislative Chamber. The House is under Call for the purpose of resolving a vote on the advancement of LB 269A. It is proper that all members be in their seats during the time that the House is under Call. All unauthorized personnel remove yourselves from the floor of the Legislature and as you...please record your presence so that we can determine who is here this morning and who we know are excused and who is not here. Senator Marsh, record your presence, please. Senator Higgins, please. Senator Higgins. Senator VonMinden, would you record your presence. Senator Schmit and Senator DeCamp. Senators Higgins and DeCamp. Members are properly to be in their seats during the time the House is under Call. We are asking for the return of Senators Higgins and DeCamp for Call of the House. Senator Higgins seems to be the only one that is not in the seat, that is not excused. Very well, we will proceed with a vote on LB 269A. Please, quiet in the Chamber. I believe a roll call has been requested so we need quiet.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on pages 1419 and 1420.)

PRESIDENT: Quiet in the Chamber, please.

CLERK: (Continued reading the roll call vote.) 26 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the A bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion carried and LB 269A is advanced. The Call of the House is raised. LB 476A.

CLERK: Mr. President, 476A offered by Senator Warner. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, 476 is the sunset bill dealing with the pharmacy board and this is the A bill to accompany it, cash funds. I move it be advanced.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 476A. Is there further discussion? If not, all those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the A bill, Mr. President.
