LB 476A, 539A

PRESIDENT: LB 476A is advanced. The next is LB 539A.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 539A offered by Senator Carsten. (Read title).

PRESIDENT: Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, I move for the advancement of LB 539A. This is another bill with a cash revolving fund for the implementation of LB 539. I move for its advance.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 539A. Is there further discussion? If not, all those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays on adoption to move the A bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion is carried and LB 539A is advanced. Next, reports.

CLERK: Mr. President, the Retirement Systems Committee reports favorably upon the appointment of certain individuals to the Public Employee Retirement Board. The report is on page 1385 of the Journal. (See page 1420 of the Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: Yes. There are six appointments to the Public Employees Retirement Board, the governing board with regards to retirement systems. Three of these are appointments by Governor Thone. Three are appointments by Governor Kerrey. According to statute, half of them are coming from the plans effected and the other are from the public at large. The names are Phil Kaldahl, Alcurtis Robinson, Jean Jeffrey, Tom Lynch, Everett Green, Harold Salter. I have copies here of their biographies and disclosure information if anyone wants that. The committee heard testimony for them and feel they are all very qualified and a good diverse group of people and would move their confirmation.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the committee report? If not, all those in favor of the confirmation report from the committee vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the report.
