talk about the increased overhead expense to industry, and then we will talk about the employee too where he is negligent and he is injured and won't receive enough to live on. I hope you remember as you vote on LB 158 the original intent, the historic intent behind the compromise that was made between employers and employees. As amended for the moment I would ask you to advance LB 158 to Select File. Thank you.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Wiitala. There are no other lights on so we will proceed with a vote on this measure. It requires 25 votes. All those in favor of advancement vote aye, those opposed vote no. Voting aye, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Landis voting yes.

SENATOR LANDIS: The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 1 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR LANDIS: LB 158 advances. We are now on LB 158A. Senator Wiitala, do you wish to move LB 158A.

SENATOR WIITALA: Yes, Mr. Speaker, I would just move for the advancement of LB 158A, please.

SENATOR LANDIS: Since there has been an amendment to the bill, can we anticipate that there will be a Select File amendment to comport with what we have just done?

SENATOR WIITALA: Yes, we can go with that assumption. Thank you.

SENATOR LANDIS: All right. Since there is no one else that wishes to speak, we will vote now on the advancement of LB 158A. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Voting aye, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Landis voting yes.

SENATOR LANDIS: The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR LANDIS: LB 158A passes. We are now down to LB 174 introduced by the Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee. Senator Labedz.
