SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. President, and members, very, very quickly, I, too, rise in support of the advancement of LB 433, the Uniform Condominium Act. I know how hard Senator Wiitala has worked on this bill for the last two or three years, his painstaking research, the fact that he has worked with all parties concerned with the bill. I, too, introduced and passed a bill three or four years ago similar to this in significance, the Model Time Share Act, some of the same implications. I have visited with Senator Wiitala about some of my concerns. I will not go into any more detail except to say that I believe the bill now in its present form is a fine bill. I urge the body to advance it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on LB 433? The motion is to advance the bill from General File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK 32 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion carried and LB 433 is advanced. Clerk.
