Senator Warner, do you have any wish on this?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, Mr. President, I would ask for a Call of the House and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: A Call of the House has been requested and the question now is, shall the House come under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carried. The House is under Call. All members return to the legislative Chamber, take your seats, record your presence. Unauthorized personnel are to leave the floor of the Legislature. We are...the House is under Call. We understand that four members are excused at the present time. The Chair would take this opportunity to say that while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LBs 309, 454, 26, 133, 199, 199A, LB 506 and LB 155E.
