SPEAKER NICHOL PRESIDING

SPEAKER NICHOL: Check in so we can get started on LB 533 here shortly. Record your presence as you come in, please. Please check in as you come in, please. Please push your green buttons if you haven't done so. Thank you. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We're going to go back to 533, if I could have your attention just a moment again, please.
