LB 225

SPEAKER NICHOL: We'll move on to LB 225.

CLERK: Mr. President, 225 was last considered on April 6, E & R amendments were adopted. There was an amendment from Senator Beutler that was adopted on March 30. On April 6 the bill failed to advance. I have nothing pending on the bill at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hefner, did you wish to talk to the bill?

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 225.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I think this is as bad a bill...in-def-in-ite...I got to spell indefinitely correctly. I think this bill is as bad today as it was the last time we considered it only worse. Any time, Senator Hefner, you have a carcass and it has not been properly embalmed, then putrefaction sets in and the aroma therefrom is not very pleasant. That's why I say the bill is as bad today as it was the last time only worse. I'm going to offer a motion and I'm having it taken to the Clerk's desk now to indefinitely postpone this bill. I'm going to let my motion get up there and then see if that ought to be discussed instead of me taking time...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers, we're checking to see if it's in order since the kill motion was taken up the other day so if you'll give us a minute here, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, my belief is that a kill motion can be taken up on a bill as many times as we want to at any given stage of consideration as long as it's not more than once on the same day. That's my understanding and I would stand to be corrected.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers, going to rule that it's in order inasmuch as it appears to be the same as a reconsideration on the same level since we had a kill motion the other day which did not prevail. It appears that this is a reconsideration so we're going to just accept your motion, kill motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, in the interest of time and the accommodating attitude that everybody seems to have, I'll withdraw that motion and I'll just speak against the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: It is withdrawn, now do you have an amendment, Mr. Clerk?
