I guess I wonder about priorities in terms of conservation resources and I wonder in terms of delegating authority to the Natrual Resources Commission which had previously been statutory guidance, so those are concerns that I have and I just merely express them at this time and I am uncertain whether the legislation is harmed irreparably by that, but nevertheless I thought it important enough to raise on the floor.

SENATOR MARSH PRESIDING

SENATOR MARSH: Is there further debate? If not, all those in favor of the advancement of 236 signify by saying aye, opposed. It is advanced. We will take 326. Rod Johnson. I'm sorry, there is an amendment on this. Is anyone prepared to handle Schmit's amendment on the bill? Then I think we will skip over that. We are now ready for 350. LB 350, Senator Vickers.

CLERK: Mr. President, Madam Chair. . .

SENATOR VICKER: . . . Madam Chairman, if I may I would like to lay it over for now. We have some amendments that are not ready on it yet.

SENATOR MARSH: All right, thank you very much. LB 366. Senator Johnson. Rod Johnson.

CLERK: Madam Chair, I have an amendment from Senator Johnson, it is printed in the Journal on page 1158.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President and members of the body, if you recall on this bill what we are attempting to do is when a Power Review Board or a power district is trying to waive their, or trying to amend their charter, we are attempting to waive the hearing when there are no objections filed to the Power Review Board. Senator Wesely, my good friend, has raised some interest in this area, however, we have talked about it and I think he has worked out his problems with me on it. However, the amendment is just technical clarification of some problems that NPPD had with the bill, I think that solved the problem and I would just urge their adoption.

SENATOR MARSH: You have all heard the discussion about the amendment to LB 366. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Marsh voting aye.
