SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill passes with the emergency clause. May I introduce 70 students in the North balcony, visitors of Senator Labeledz's. They are from St. Thomas More School in Omaha, Father Stalinski and Milford McCauley, (phonetic) their instructors. Would you please rise and be welcomed by your Legislature. Thank you. May I just say that you are observing Final Reading, which according to Constitution requires that the bills be read in full before final passage of the bill so you are witnessing this. Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 64 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1620-1621 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 31 ayes, 15 nays, 3 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill passes. We will go on to LB 94.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Vickers would move to return LB 94 to Select File for a specific amendment. On page 8, line 5 strike the word "exemption" and insert the word "deferral".

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, I apologize for having to bring this bill back and amend it. It was an oversight I suppose on my part that we left this word "exemption" in this particular place of the bill. The bill as drafted originally used the word "exemption." Then we realized throughout the bill and we realized that really we were talking about a deferral and with the amendment on General File that this body adopted we changed the words "exemption" throughout the bill and put in the word "deferral," but undoubtedly we missed one spot and that is on page 8, line 5 we left in the word "exemption" when in actuality the entire bill is talking about a deferral of these payments and I would suggest that even on the agenda where it talks about an exemption and actually even on the front of the bill we have changed that to a deferral also so I would urge the body's adoption of this amendment to simply clarify that we are talking about a deferral all
