CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The vote is in the affirmative and the House is under Call. All members of the Legislature please return to the Chamber and record your presence and all members in the Chamber please check the board ahead of you and see that you have a green light on so that we can recognize your presence. Senator Schmit, please. Senator Kilgarin, please. Senator Higgins. Four members are excused at the present time. Senator Beutler, Senator Chambers, Senator Vard Johnson, Senator Newell, Senator Rupp. Senator DeCamp, please. Senator Rupp, the House is under Call if you would please return to the Chamber. Senator Rupp is the only member not here. What does the Sergeant discover about Senator Rupp? Senator Vickers, Senator Rupp is on his way. If it is all right with you we will proceed with the roll call vote. He is on his way.

SENATOR VICKERS: How many are excused?

PRESIDENT: (Mike not activated immediately.) ...members are excused and if Senator Rupp comes we will have our full working complement.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, let's wait until Senator Rupp gets here and then go ahead.

PRESIDENT: Very well. Very well, Senator Rupp, would you record your presence. And the Clerk will proceed with the roll call but let us have (gavel) quiet in the Chamber so that the roll call will be audible and the Clerk will not have difficulty. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 1650 of the Legislative Journal.) 15 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk? Very well.

CLERK: Mr. President, new A bill. (Read LB 356A by title for the first time as found on page 1650 of the Legislative Journal.)
