SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I would just say that a lot of people want this bill on behalf of the chiropractors and I would further add that I think the chiropractors, and I just talked to them, I talked to their lobbyist, their representatives, and they know they have gotten about ninety, ninety-five percent of all the things they ever dreamed and way more than they believed possible. So I think it would be an awful error on their part to hold up the bill because they might just find they have willing accomplices with Senator Hoagland and Chambers and Cullan and a lot of others, and if they don't want the bill, I am sure there is a lot of other people that have been opposing it that would help them prevent it from passing if that is the inclination. So those that have been kind of trying to make sure the chiropractors got their bill passed, I would suggest, and you can ask the chiropractors out there, they know it, they got about ninety percent of things they ever shot for, and way more than they ever believed possible, and the bill is in pretty good shape I think. We took a Corvette and we just slowed it down a trifle. I urge you to advance the bill.
