with other revenue raising proposals to see whether they are going to fly and the Speaker can do that as well as anyone can. Now I frankly think this is a very wise policy decision and I think this Legislature ought to recognize that. For those who **choose** to fight one issue at a time, I do not know what their motives are, their arguments are not particularly clear to me. Because of that I think we ought to take the most prudent step and that is to bracket for a period of time 396 and other measures so that we can bring them up and get some sort of an idea what is likely to be on the revenue enhancement side. Then deal with the appropriation issues in terms of expenditures. With that in mind I urge this Legislature to bracket, for a short period of time, LB 396.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Newell motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 29 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to bracket the bill.
