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elevator closed down, then the bond should be large enough to pay the people who have warehouse receipts, pay them off in full. I agree with him that you shouldn't keep a grain ticket. There's nothing to secure a grain ticket and that's why the law says the Grain Warehouse Act provides that. A warehouse receipt must be issued in a certain number of days and that a farmer or producer does simply not carry that grain ticket around in his pocket. I think if we're going to do this right that we should return the bill, amend it to take out any bond covering bad checks because there's no limit to what the bad checks might amount to. They can't cover this with a bond. Let's amend it and then take a vote on it. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chronister.

SENATOR CHRONISTER: I call for the previous question.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do I see five hands? I do. The question is shall debate cease. All those in favor vote aye, opposed, nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Remmers, would you like to close, please?

SENATOR REMMERS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, just briefly. A suggestion that we can go with this and if it doesn't work out, we can change it. That doesn't help the elevator that has to close down in the meanwhile. Again all we're saying is that the bonds should simply cover the grains in the elevator, warehouse receipts but not for bad checks. Now, there may be some elevators going under but, you know, these small elevators in my area were more concerned about this bill than they were the famous double jeopardy that we hassled about at quite some length. They were much more concerned about this. They said they pretty well looked out for their double jeopardy. But this was the situation where it's not their fault. If the bond, the price of the bond goes up no matter how good, how good a job they do, how well they run their business, that cost of the bond is still going to go up and be prohibitive for them. I would urge you to support this, to return the bill for the amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Question of, is the returning of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Need 25 votes. Only one is excused, Senator Remmers. Record, Mr. Clerk.
