(See page 1875 in the Journal). LR 84 by Law Enforcement Justice Advisory Committee calls for a study on judicial redistricting and court merger. (See page 1875-6 in the Journal). 85 by Judiciary Committee calls for a study of the basic purposes, policies, and goals of corrections, sentencing and parole in Nebraska. (See page 1876 in the Journal). And 86, by Judiciary, offers a study regarding the feasibility of creating a Youth Service Commission. (See page 1877 in the Journal). I have an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator DeCamp on 469. (See page 1872-3 in the Journal). Your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports 207 correctly engrossed in 476, correctly engrossed, both signed by Senator Rod Johnson as Chair. (See page 1874 in the Journal, correctly re-engrossed). That's all I have, Senator.
