SENATOR CHRONISTER: Senator Remmers.

SENATOR REMMERS: Senator Chronister, members of the Legislature, I don't know whether I want to withdraw it or move to advance it but I, I would like to comment that I think Marge came up with or Senator Higgins came up with a novel idea that I think has a lot of merit.
