access to communications, access to transportation, the quality of life, the kinds of things by the way that are underwritten by tax dollars. It is also important to recognize that corporations are the users of services that governments provide. They use police services. They use fire services. Their employees use parks. They are the beneficiaries of zoning administration. They are the beneficiaries of economic development, of state administrations, of roads and many other services underwritten by taxes. There is no reason to break our traditional linkage between individuals and corporations. I object to the Hefner amendment. I hope it is defeated.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I turn my time over to Elroy.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to withdraw my amendment and take up the DeCamp amendment.
