CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to go under Call.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Will all Senators please return to your seats and punch in and show your presence, and for the visitors that are here when the House goes under Call all Senators are to return to their seats and be seated and then we will have a roll call vote. Each Senators name shall be read alphabetically and they will vote yes or no. At the present time it takes 30 votes to do what we are trying to do which is override part of a bill that the Governor vetoed. Usually it takes 25 votes to pass a bill but it takes 30 votes to override. Howard Peterson, please punch in. Senator Warner, Senator Wiitala, Senator Schmit, Senator Pirsch, Senator Higgins, Senator Kilgarin, Senator Lamb, Senator Goodrich. We are looking for Senator Goodrich, Senator Lamb and Senator Warner. Will you please see if we can round up those three Senators. Senator Schmit, what is your pleasure?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, who is missing?

SENATOR HABERMAN: We are still looking for Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well, I think we can find Senator Goodrich, wherever you are, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Goodrich, would you please report to the Chamber. Senator Higgins, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. Chairman, before we vote on this, could you explain the amendment or read the amendment or I have been on the phone in the back of the room and I want to be sure what it is, if you would please before we vote. Thank you.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes, Senator Higgins, it is pursuant to Rule 6, Section 14 (c) that the Legislature override the Governor's line-item veto of the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, Program 202, in Section 50, on page 59 of LB 602. Do you still wish to wait for Senator Goodrich, Senator Schmit, or shall we start? Senator Schmit, Senator Goodrich hasn't been in this morning. Go ahead and call the roll please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1944 and 1945, Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Having failed to receive the 30 votes required, the motion is defeated. At this time I would
