SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the purpose of the motion is not to take the funds away from the cancer research although obviously that is what occurs. Senator Cullan remarked on General File and I had assumed after General File the Legislature had made a decision and the appropriations bill was drafted to reflect that decision and I did not intend to further raise the issue. Then when the state's picture became more difficult as it has progressively become more difficult, then it seemed to me and the Appropriations Committee, at least a majority of them felt that maybe at least for one more year that that \$900,000 ought to remain in the general fund for to help ease the receipt problems, still maintain the same level appropriation we now have for these activities and then allow the bill to be implemented next year when hopefully all of the economy related problems we have have been laid to rest in our past. Then certainly this program could go ahead.

SENATOR HABERMAN: The motion is to return LB 192 to Select File for Senator Warner's specific amendment. It is a machine vote. It takes 25 votes.

CLERK: Senator Haberman voting no.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Have you all voted? It is eleven-fifteen, will you please vote if you are going to vote. There are five excused, Senator Warner. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SENATOR HABERMAN: The motion has failed. The next item on the agenda is reading, the Final Reading of LB 198. Oh, yes, I am sorry, read LB 192.

CLERK: (Final Reading of LB 192.)

SENATOR HABERMAN: The motion is, shall LB 192 pass with the emergency clause? It takes 33 votes. All those in favor vote yes, all those in favor (sic) vote no.

CLERK: Senator Haberman voting yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: The Clerk please record the vote.
