to them, but this is an additional benefit I don't think they deserve and furthermore keep in mind that this changes from local control, present hospital authority are created at the county level so local county boards determine whether or not to allow these issuances of tax exempt bonds. This would take and leap over that county level decision making, go to the state level of the board for a business development finance fund and bypass those local authorities. I think in terms of local control, in terms of controlling our health care costs LB 429 should be defeated. I would ask your support for the kill motion, I would ask for a roll call at this time, Mr. Speaker.
