CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hefner's report is found on page 1987 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, members of the body, the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee held a hearing on the appointment of Albert T. Davis to the Nebraska Arts Council last Wednesday. The reason we waited this long is so that Mr. Davis wouldn't have to drive in just for this short hearing. He was going to be in Lincoln Wednesday so and so we had the hearing. He has been appointed by Governor Kerrey to a full term, which is three years. The Miscellaneous Subjects Committee voted unanimously to accept the appointment. I would urge this body to accept the appointment of Albert T. Davis to the Nebraska Arts Council. I so move, Mr. President.
