All those in favor say aye, opposed no. The motion carried. And regretfully I say the Call is raised. LB 146.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator Chambers to be inserted in the Journal. (Opinion regarding LB 59. See pages 2170-72 of the Legislative Journal).

Mr. President, 146, first thing I have on the bill are E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson.

SENAOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, I move for the adoption of the E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: You heard the motion. All those in favor say aye, opposed no. The motion carried, the amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment from Senator Pirsch to the bill found on page 2058.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you Mr. President, members of the body, when we discussed LB 146 on General File, you will recall that Senator Goodrich raised a concern about the privateness of the medical histories and while this was old language and only added the adoptee to the adopting parents, I do realize that is a valid concern for citizens today in the State of Nebraska. Therefore this amendment simply adds the words "The medical history shall not include the names of the biological parents of the adopted person or the place of birth of the adopted person", which will guarantee that anonymity that I believe Senator Goodrich was concerned with and I did show this to Senator Goodrich and he is in agreement with it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion of the Pirsch amendment? If not, the question is the adoption of Senator Pirsch's amendment to LB 146. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Voting on the Pirsch amendment to LB 146. Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President on adoption of Senator Pirsch's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.
