SENATOR WARNER: Yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Now with Senator Newell here we should all be here. Did you want a roll call vote, Senator Warner?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. We're voting on the final passage of LB 617 with the emergency clause. Would you please, all of you must return to your seats, we're on Final Reading. You must return. We're going to have roll call. We must be quiet so the Clerk can hear your response. We must have it quiet. You just simply can't hear up here. Thank you.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2259 of the Journal.)  
32 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill fails. Senator Warner, did you wish recognition?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I think...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Were you trying to say we're one vote short, or something like that?

SENATOR WARNER: We're already at that point. Mr. President, for purposes of discussion I'll file a motion which is to return 617 to Select File to strike the Schmit amendment that was adopted on May 4th, on page 1924, so I've got something to speak to.

SPEAKER NICHOL: That is for discussion. Did you want to discuss it further, Senator Warner?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, the reason I would offer the amendment is that this bill should have the emergency clause because it's the one other than the thing we're arguing about that adjusted a number of fees. There is about \$700,000 of fees. Should the emergency clause not take affect we'd be a couple of months short, which could be like \$120,000 or so of additional general fund appropriation we'd have to make somewhere. I would withdraw the motion if there is one...there isn't anything filed to reconsider the emergency clause...I'd withdraw but if there isn't I need to proceed with something.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You wish to withdraw your motion, Senator Warner?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: It is withdrawn for now.
