

on overruling the Chair. If you agree with the Chair that we have in the act of reconsidering repealed the adoption of the Hoagland amendment, then you will want to vote no because what I have offered, what I have said is that we have not repealed the Hoagland amendment. In the event you agree with me, you will want to vote green and overrule the Chair. If you agree with the Chair's interpretation that in other words Senator Hoagland will have to move a second time and adopt that amendment a second time and repeat the debate and the shoe is on his foot rather than on the opponents of the Hoagland amendment, then you will want to vote red. I would suggest to you that a number of senators were not aware of that implication when they were voting on reconsideration. I think to be true to that point of view, you will want to vote green and overrule the Chair. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Now in defense of the Chair what I would like to say is that I did not say we had struck the amendment at all. I said it is back before us like any other amendment is. That is all I have said about the amendment to start with. Now if you want to overrule the Chair, you will vote green. That is very right. And if you do not want to overrule the Chair, then you will vote red. I think where the confusion comes in is when we usually reconsider anything we reconsider it because it failed. This time it was because it had passed. So all I am saying is that it is back before us as the amendment. He would have to put it up again as to whether you want it and we have another vote on it. So those in favor of overruling the Chair will vote green, those sustaining the Chair will vote red. It takes 25 votes to overrule the Chair. Have you all voted? I will hold it open another ten seconds.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR CLARK: We are under Call.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. In that case perhaps we could check in and accept call in votes, and then do a roll call vote.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, everyone will check in, please. If everyone sitting in their seat will check in, please, we will get this out of the way. Senator Lowell Johnson, will you check in, please. Senator Labeledz. Senator Jacobson. We only have one excused. That is Senator Haberman. Newell, Vickers and Jacobson are the ones we are looking for. Everyone will remain in their seats, please.
