Mr. President, I have a new A bill, LB 481A, by Senator Warner. (Read title for the first time as found on page 2315 of the Journal.)

I have two new resolutions, 198, by Senators Landis, Beutler, Wesely, Marsh, Fowler and Warner. (Read LR 198 as found on page 2315 of the Legislative Journal.) And 199, Mr. President, by Senator Warner. (Read LR 199 as found on page 2316 of the Journal.) That will be laid over as well, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Higgins.
