PRESIDENT: The motion of Senator DeCamp is withdrawn. The bill is Senator Warner's I guess if he wants to.... Senator Carsten, do you want to move to advance?

SENATOR CARSTEN: I move LB 27 as amended be advanced, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 27. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is to advance LB 27. Please record your vote if you wish to vote. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 8 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is advanced. Is there anything that you care to read into the record at this time, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing to read in, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Next, the Speaker has asked us to take up LB 297. Chair recognizes the Speaker.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I understand from Senator Warner that since this was brought up yesterday, it will not be necessary to run, is that true, Senator DeCamp?

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, Mr. President, this is our famous sign bill but we just spent two hours on another one and this could engender at least as much time. Maybe the better part of valor and discretion is to take it up in January and I hope, I hope this sets an example. We'll pass over this one and then I'll pull all the amendments I have on Senator Warner's other sign bill, 120 which we have to get passed this year and we'll negotiate over the summer.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Final Reading then. We're ready to proceed to Final Reading. I'd like to announce to members outside the Chamber, we are ready to proceed to Final Reading. If you would all take your seats, we will do so and proceed as soon as everyone is in their seats and unauthorized personnel are off the floor of the Legislature. The Clerk has amendments on the desk on LB 59. If all members please take their seats, we are on Final Reading now, although there's an amendment on 59. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.
