LB 159, 626, 193

SENATOR ROD JOHNSON: Mr. President, I move we adopt the E&R amendments.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion to adopt the amendments. All those in favor, say aye, opposed, no. The motion carried. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR ROD JOHNSON: Mr. President, I move we advance LB 159 to E&R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to advance the bill. You've heard the motion. All those in favor, say aye, opposed, no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. I presume now we revert to the top of second page of our agenda, LB 193. Do you have any matters for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, I have an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator Cullan. (See pages 2400-01 in the Journal). And Senator Schmit would like to print amendments to Legislative Bill 626 in the Journal. (See page 2400 in the Journal).

PRESIDENT: Very well. LB 193.

CLERK: Mr. President, 193 has been considered by the Legislature on February 11. There was an amendment by Senator Johnson that was adopted. I now have an amendment by Senators Beutler that's found on page 107, there's two amendments, Senator. The first is on page 1074. And then there's a second one, 1075.

PRESIDENT: Do you wish to take the amendments separately, Senator?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I believe so. One is a matter of philosophy and will be discussed. The other, I think, will be fairly perfunctory.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes you on the first amendment, Senator Beutler. May we have order in the Chamber? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, the amendment again, if you'd like to look at it is on page 1074 of the Journal so you can see the exact language that we're, that we're, will be discussing. It was originally Senator Doyle's amendment and I am picking it up on his behalf.
