As you know, everything must get off Select File today to be final read, to be read finally tomorrow or the next day. There is no amending after today. Now if you will look at your agenda, at the bottom we have a few of those that are marked off because we did them last Friday, but left on there are 599 and also 118 will be back and also 259 has an amendment on that must be handled today, and then the nonpriority bills, 490, 27 and 626 must be moved today if they are to become law this year. So with that in mind, and if you have any amendments to make, today is the day or else that is it. So I just wanted to bring your attention to this fact. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Members will please take their seats as we go into Final Reading. We will not go into Final Reading until all of our working force is seated. We are about to go into Final Reading. Members please take their seats. All members in their seats, please, as we go into Final Reading. We will proceed with Final Reading, LB 254. Quiet in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.)
