CLERK: Mr. President, yes, I do, one resolution. LR 211 offered by the Business and Labor Committee. (Read resolution as found on page 2455 of the Legislative Journal.) That will be laid over, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Very well. LB 626.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a series of motions on LB 626. The first I have....I have E & R amendments first of all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, I move for the adoption of the E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Motion has been made to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 626. All those in favor say say aye. Opposed. Motion carried. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have on the bill is by Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Would you read the motion, Pat?

CLERK: In the Beutler amendment on page 2411 of the Journal on page 1, line 2 of the new matter strike "for industrial development" and insert "under subdivision (3) of section 19 of this act".

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this is a purely technical amendment which cleans up the amendment which was adopted a couple days ago on this particular bill. At that time we adopted an amendment you will recall that gave small businesses a portion of the funds to be assured that the funds were distributed across the whole spectrum of businesses by size. At that point in time, instead of referencing a section of the statutes we used the word "industrial" but to be technically correct we should reference the section of the statute that talks about industrial as opposed to agricultural and housing. You will recall that really this is combining three different funds, the housing, the agricultural and then the industrial commercial. So all we are doing is referencing technically that part of section 19 which has to do with industrial to make it technically correct.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cullan. The motion is on the Beutler amendment.
