SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. President, I would like a point of personal privilege...

SENATOR LANDIS: State your point.

SENATOR HIGGINS: ...and I understand that a point of personal privilege you do not address a bill and I do not intend to address this bill but I do intend to say this. I have never since I have been here voted as a Democrat but I have voted so many times with Senator John DeCamp, a Republican. After his remarks today, I regret every one of those votes and, Senator DeCamp, you owe me and every Democrat in this legislative body an apology, and if I don't get it, you will never get another vote from me nor will any other Republican because if I am going to have the name I will have the game. Thank you.

SENATOR LANDIS: We will now proceed with vote on this specific amendment to LB 629 to return it to Select File for the adoption of the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Voting aye, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Landis voting yes.

SENATOR LANDIS: 15 seconds. The Clerk will record. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would again ask for a Call of the House and a roll call vote.

SENATOR LANDIS: The question is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Voting aye, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Landis voting yes.

SENATOR LANDIS: The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR LANDIS: The House is under Call. All Senators return to your seat, check in, and we will proceed with a roll call vote. There are five excused, Senator Warner, Senator Morehead, Senator Hoagland, Senator Nichol, Senator Rod Johnson, Senator Chambers. Mr. Clerk, will you proceed with the roll call please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2469 and 2470, Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.
