CLERK: No. Do you want me to announce the vote now? (Read the record vote as found on pages 2520 and 2521 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A sufficient majority having voted in the affirmative, the bill is declared passed. Proceed to LB 224.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 224 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is shall LB 224 pass? All those in favor, vote aye, opposed, vote no. We're voting on LB 224. Please record your vote. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read vote.) (See pages 2521-22 in the Journal). Vote is 42 ayes, 5 nays, 2 present not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Sufficient majority having voted in the affirmative, the bill is declared passed. LB 228.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 228 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is shall LB 228 pass? All those in favor, vote aye, opposed, vote nay. Voting on LB 228. Please record your vote on LB 228. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: (Read vote.) (See page 2522 in the Journal). 37 ayes, 10 nays, 2 present not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Majority having voted in the affirmative, the bill is declared passed. LB 244.
