time that it comes up, again I repeat there are numerous potentials for reductions, as there always are, but you are entitled to know what they are and where they are and most importantly there are a whole series of them, that the Appropriations Committee is not in the position to do, or recommend, unless the body as a whole is willing to pass the legislation which permits it. So it is important that the order of things are such that that too can be accomplished. I would urge that the resolution be voted down at this time. I do want to add one other word. There was some comment made about requests, I believe, and there is something like one hundred sixty-five, sixty-seven million dollars in requests not counting capital construction and not counting A bills, but we have never to my knowledge appropriated total requests. As a matter of fact, we...seldom is that anything more than a statistic once. That is never ever looked at again. So I would hope the body would vote down the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to indefinitely postpone or disapprove resolution 221. A record vote has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is to indefinitely just postpone or disapprove LR 221. 25 votes necessary to carry Senator Warner's motion. Have you all voted? Please record your vote. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record. Senator DeCamp has requested a roll call.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 213 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 17 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Warner motion carries and the resolution is indefinitely postponed. The Chair would like to announce that there were guests of Senators Harris and Warner in the Chamber earlier, forty-two Kindergarten students from Fredstrom Elementary, Highlands at Lincoln with Ed May as teacher. It will be recorded in the Journal. Does the Clerk have matters on the desk?
