SPEAKER NICHOL: Did you wish to close, Senator Goodrich? The question is the advancement of LB 333. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 333 is advanced. LB 368.

CLERK: Mr. President, 368 (read title). The bill was read on January 17th last year, referred to the Urban Affairs Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis, as Chairman of the Government Committee.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, LB 368 has three provisions. It was brought to us by the League of Municipalities. It was supported in committee by the City Manager of Kearney, the Mayor of Norfolk, and the representative from the Village of Paxton. The first provision is that it prohibits the mayor or city council members from holding any other elected office while serving as mayor or city council member. This really parrots a provision that appears in the election laws but makes certain that that now appears in the municipal statutes. Secondly, it makes the language which is now available in
