CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the second amendment.

SENATOR HEFNER: Motion carried.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR HEFNER: Now we are back to the bill, to LB 216. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. President, again the bill is an attempt to deal with some changes in County Employee Retirement Plan. I'm not sure what the cost item is but it is not anything I think even significant. What we are trying to do is provide some equalization and harmony in the statutes. It is a technical clean up bill that we had last session and it was held over to this year.

SENATOR HEFNER: We are ready for the vote. All of those in favor will vote aye, those against the bill will vote against it.

CLERK: Senator Hefner voting yes.

SENATOR HEFNER: Would you please vote. Would you please vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR HEFNER: The bill is advanced. Before we go to the next bill I would like to introduce a guest of Senator Kilgarin's. This guest is her Dad, Mr. Kilgarin. Will you please stand and be recognized. The next bill on the agenda is LB 14 introduced by Senator Kilgarin.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 14 offered by Senator Kilgarin. (Read title.) The bill was read and introduced last January 6th, referred to the Revenue Committee. It was referred to General File, Mr. President, and Senator Kilgarin does have a technical amendment striking, "on page 5, line 25, strike '1983' and insert '1984'."
