SPEAKER NICHOL PRESIDING

SPEAKER NICHOL: (Recorder not activated) presence. Those in your offices please come to the Chamber so we can begin. Thank you. If you are in the Legislative Chamber, please record your presence. Members of the Legislature, please return to the Legislative Chambers and record your presence please. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Wesely, are you ready to go on 540? Okay. Before you do that, why don't we let the Clerk read some stuff in.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Barrett would ask unanimous consent to add his name to 825.

SPEAKER NICHOL: No objection, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review reports they have carefully examined LB 49 and recommend that same be placed on Select File with E & R amendments; 492 and 333 all on Select File with E & R amendments. (See pages 306-309 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, LB 540 was introduced by Senator Wesely. (Read.) The bill was read on January 19 last year, referred to Urban Affairs. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are committee amendments pending by the Urban Affairs Committee.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Newell, do you wish to take the amendments?

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, the activities...the amendments simply define the work activity center and change the number from ten to fif...from fifteen clients down to ten. It allows for cities with the home rule charter to participate in the programs and provides for public notice of procedures and the workshops, notifying them that the governing body is accepting bids from sheltered workshops to
